GOSPEL: John 1:1-14

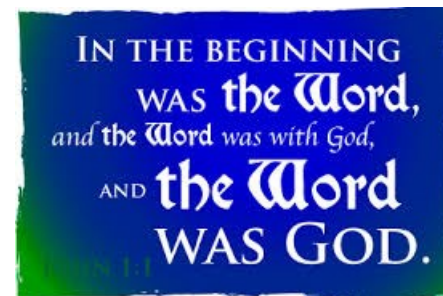
P: The holy gospel according to John, the 1st chapter.
