Recognition of Christian Men on Father's Day

A reading from Exodus.

The Israelites had journeyed from Rephidim, entered the wilderness of Sinai, and camped in the wilderness; Israel camped at the foot of the mountain. Gospel: Matthew 9:35-10:8 (9-23)

The holy gospel according to Matthew.

Glory to you, O Lord.

Jesus went about all the cities and villages, teaching
in the synagogues, and proclaiming the good news of the
kingdom and curing every disease and every sickness. When
he saw the crowds, he had compassion for them, because they
were harassed and helpless, like sheep without a shepherd.
Then he said to his disciples, “The harvest is plentiful, but the
laborers are few; therefore ask the Lord of the harvest to send
out laborers into his harvest.” Then Jesus summoned his
twelve disciples and gave them authority over unclean spirits,
to cast them out, and to cure every disease and every sickness.
These are the names of the twelve apostles: first, Simon, also
called Peter, and his brother Andrew; James son of Zebedee,
and his brother John; Philip and Bartholomew; Thomas and
Matthew the tax collector; James son of Alphaeus, and Thaddeus
the son of Zebedee; Simon the Cananaean, and Judas Iscariot,
the one who betrayed him. These twelve Jesus sent out with the
following instructions: “Go nowhere among the Gentiles, and
do not enter any town of the Samaritans, but go rather to the
lost sheep of the house of Israel. As you go, proclaim the good news,
‘the kingdom of heaven has come near.’ Cure the sick, raise
the dead, cleanse the lepers, cast out demons. You receive
nothing without payment; give without payment.”
